TREP\$ (short for enTREPreneur\$) is a six week after-school program in which the children in grades 4-8 are taught everything they need to know to start their own businesses. The program ends with a large scale flea-market style event called The TREP\$ Marketplace, giving the new entrepreneurs the opportunity to launch their businesses, selling real products to real customers for real money!

The initial pilot of the program TREP\$ earned NJPTA's President's Champion for Children Award. As the focus of the cover story of the June issue of 'Education Update,' a publication of ASCD (Association for School Curriculum and Development), TREP\$ was recognized as an entrepreneurship education leader. TREP\$ is currently offered in many US States, Canada and Saudi Arabia. In addition one of the schools that piloted the program was actually filmed for an episode of the PBS series Classroom Close-up.

They created rockets, drums, cookie booths, a decorative birthday cake, military equipment, dolls, buildings (including The White House), towers and masks. In the process, the First Graders found new uses for recycled materials and plan to make more fun projects in the future.






Kindness rocks have been placed around Hamburg School.
