COMMITTEE REPORTS

State & County School Boards - No report.

<u>Sussex County Educational Services Commission</u> – Mrs. Ambrose updated the Board on the recent Sussex County Educational Services Commissions meeting.

<u>Liaison with the Hamburg Borough Council</u> – Mrs. Frayko commented on the possibility of adding the re-paving of the walkway from the school to the athletic fields as an alternate to the Hamburg Borough bid specification, if the Borough is doing any road paving in 2017 (similar to what has been done in the past). A brief discussion ensued.

<u>Building & Grounds</u> – Mr. Gillen and various Board members commented on how well the Front Entry Improvement Project turned out. Mr. Jinks stated the project is being closed out and the issue of the rain water running off of the edge of the roof of the small storage room will be addressed in the spring.

BOARD SECRETARY'S REPORT

- Walking path repairs at the Hamburg School
- Access walkway to the church parking lot.

Mr. Jinks and the Board Secretary updated the Board on the Front Entry Upgrade Project at the Hamburg School.

On motion by Mrs. Frayko seconded by Mrs. Davis, and carried unanimously by roll call vote, accepted the Front Entry Renovations Project at the Hamburg School as completed and to approve payment request # 5 [the final payment request] in the amount of \$35,540.69 as submitted by Alexander the Great, Inc. [the final contract amount is \$282,097.88] and it was noted that the Board's Insurance Agent has acceptance of the maintenance bond and the certificate of insurance as submitted by Alexander The Great [DOCUMENT A-1].

On motion by Mrs. Frayko, seconded by Mr. Gillen, and carried unanimously by roll call vote, as per the Superintendent's recommendation, accepted the Superintendent's HIB report of zero (0) instances of HIB for the time period of 15 October and 17 November 2016 as presented to the Board on 29 November 2016.

Mr. Jinks reported that there was one HIB investigation conducted between 18 November and 16 December 2016. The case was reported by a parent via email as comments, gestures or acts targeting their child during class. The HIB School Specialist and District Coordinator investigated the incident by interviewing the accused students, students who were reported as witnesses and the teachers that were mentioned by the parent. Based on the findings of the investigation, the claim was determined to be unsubstantiated. However, the recommendation was made to keep an open discussion among the parents, teachers, administration and special services to provide support for the students involved in this case.
