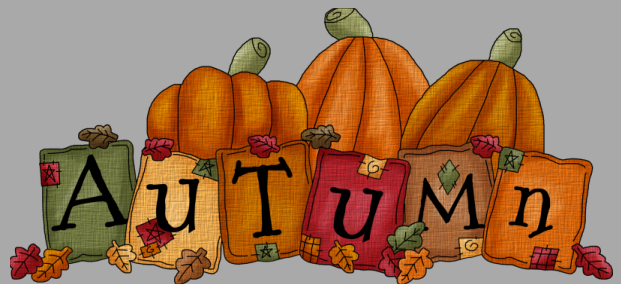

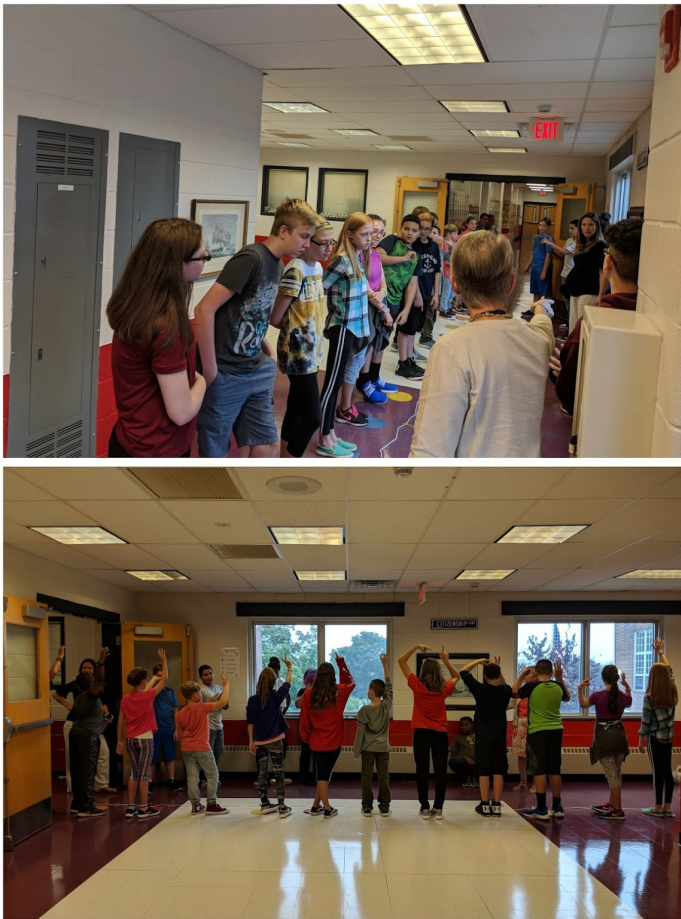

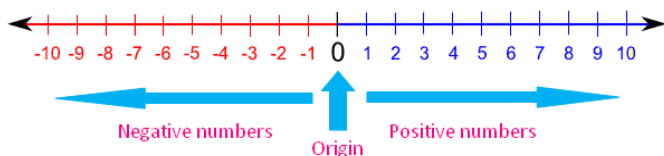

## TOSHIBA

Leading Innovation >>>

Toshiba America Foundation awarded the Hamburg School a \$6,000 grant to replicate a canine prosthetic. The middle school students will partner with the canine's handler and a veterinarian to cast a mold, use a 3 dimensional scanner to digitize the mold, then print the prosthetic using a 3D printer and filament. Students will journal and reflect throughout the process using a green screen broadcast system. The Toshiba grant for middle school students has allowed for the purchase of two 3D printers, a 3D scanner, and an Apple iPad studio setup to allow for the broadcasting. The students and staff are very excited to meet our canine partner and look forward to successfully developing a prosthetic. 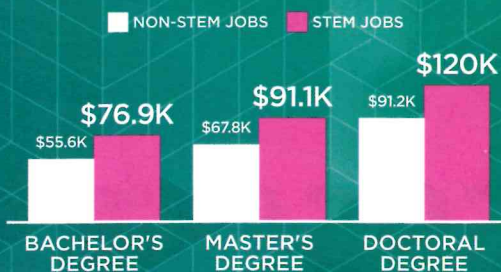
