<u>State & County School Boards</u> — Due to the recent state aid reduction to the district, Mr. Jones attended an Adhoc meeting with neighboring districts to discuss shared services. He felt that Superintendents should attend future meetings to help with input and decision making.

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<u>Sussex County Educational Services Commission</u> – Mrs. Ambrose stated the commission recently celebrated its fortieth anniversary as well as they began strategic planning through the use of New Jersey School Boards Association. She also stated that there were many holiday activities going on and that the commission will hold a White Ball in January. In addition, Mrs. Romano said five paraprofessionals were hired by the Franklin Board of Education for the preschool and she continues to provide training for the Crisis Intervention program. A Project Health program was started for senior high school students to train and work in various areas at Newton Memorial Hospital.

<u>Liaison with the Hamburg Borough Council</u> – Mrs. Frayko stated that a take a book - leave a book program was discussed and that the family fun night was a success.

<u>Building & Grounds</u> – Mr. Gillen stated that the appropriate paperwork had been submitted to the Department of Education for the installation of a new HVAC system in the cafeteria. He also said that the district will probably go out for bid for the project in middle of January.
