Mr. Jones presented the students with a certificate of recognition.

Mrs. Michele Sealander, teacher, presented a grant she received from Thor Labs in the amount of \$4,500. The grant is for a Hydroponics Lab and Robotics Program. She explained how each grade level would participate in the program – see attached.

Mrs. Amy Breitenbach, Pre K teacher, and Mrs. Sharon Triolo, Pre K teacher, gave a Power Point Presentation on extending the Pre-K program to full time for the 2019-20 school year. They stated that there would be no additional cost for staff if the Board implemented the program. Several questions were raised regarding any additional costs for furniture, and curriculum alignment with state requirements. In addition, she reviewed the Project Search program that is offered to special needs students to participate in a program at Newton Hospital with the possibility of being hired to work at the hospital at the end of the program.
