(Pyrocide 100)EYES: May cause temporary irritation, tearing, and blurred vision. SKIN: Can cause skin irritation. Can cause a burning or prickling sensation on more sensitive areas (face, eyes, mouth). Prolonged or frequently repeated skin contact may cause allergic reactions in some individuals. SKIN ABSORPTION: Harmful if absorbed through the skin. INGESTION: May be harmful if swallowed. Small amounts of this product aspirated into the respiratory system during ingestion or vomiting may cause mild to severe lung injury. INHALATION: Excessive inhalation of mists can cause nasal and respiratory irritation(Conquer) Same as above

Pesticide product label instructions and precautions related to Public Safety(Pyrocide 100) CAUTION. OSHA-COMBUSTIBLE LIQUID. DO NOT use or store near heat, sparks, open flame, or any other ignition sources. Harmful if absorbed through the skin. Contains petroleum distillates - Vomiting may cause aspiration pneumonia. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, and clothing. Wear a long-sleeved shirt and long pants, shoes and socks. Wear chemically-impervious gloves such as

Barrier Laminate, Neoprene Rubber, Nitrile Rubber, or Viton. (Conquer)Same as above and avoid breathing vapors or spray. Do not contaminate water or food. Do not eat, smoke, drink or apply cosmetics in work area.
Note: as required by law, we are advising you of the following statement: The Office of Pesticide Programs of the United States Environmental Protection Agency has stated: "Where possible, persons who potentially are sensitive, such as pregnant women, infants, and children, should avoid any unnecessary pesticide exposure."
