### PUBLIC HEARING ON THE PROPOSED FY 2024-25 BUDGET (DOCUMENT C & DOCUMENT D)

The tentative FY 2024-25 Budget was presented and approved by the Board on 20 March 2024, was advertised in the 19 April 2024 edition of the New Jersey Herald. The Executive County Superintendent approved the FY 2024-25 Budget as submitted, with no changes to the Budget as adopted by the Board at the March 20th meeting. The 2024-2025 budget includes an adjustment for increased costs of health benefits in the amount of \$20,498. The additional funds will be used to pay for the additional increases in health benefit premiums. WHEREAS, the Hamburg Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:24B-1.2(b), to a maximum expenditure for the 2024 = 2025 school year of \$1,500 per employee (primarily mileage reimbursement for staff travel) for staff and board members.

On a motion by Mr. Gillen, seconded by Mr. Dreifus, and carried unanimously by voice vote, the Board adopted the FY 2024-25 Budget for the Hamburg Borough Board of Education that includes sufficient funds to provide curriculum and instruction which will enable all students to achieve the New Jersey Learning Standards, and is in compliance with N.J.S.A 18A and N.J.A.C. Title 6 and 6A, as follows:
